Sue Buckmaster is Artistic Director of Theatre-Rites, a director, dramaturg, puppetry specialist and teacher. She has worked with a wide variety of companies including the National Theatre, RSC, Young Vic, Sadler's Wells, Complicité and the Akram Khan Company for whom she directed Chotto Desh and Chotto Xenos. She has directed over 25 touring and site-specific productions for Theatre-Rites in the UK and internationally and later this year will create Something In The Air for Schauspielhaus Bochum.

Make Your Own Jelly Fish

reuse 2 plastic shopping bags to make a jellyfish. You'll also need some scissors, two elastic bands and a stick



1. Take one of your plastic bags and, keeping the air in the bag, tie the handles together so that when you shake it, it seems full. This forms the body. 2. Take the other plastic bag and cut it into two large pieces. Then cut long circular strips out of each section to make the tentacles. You can use more than one bag for this. Once you have enough tentacles take your stick and attach the body with one of the elastic bands. Then take the second elastic band and secure all the tentacles.

Make Your Own Turtle

Great way to reuse plastic bottles. You'll also need a pen, glue, scissors and some old coloured card







1.Cut the bottom of a plastic bottle so the indents form the body of the turtle. 2.Using a piece of coloured card draw the outline of the turtle and cut around this. 3.Then stick the bottom of the bottle to the card to create your own turtle.
